## Sharing

Sharing is a new weekly homework assignment for every child. The purpose of sharing is to further develop your child's oral language, listening skills, and comfort level when speaking in front of a group. Your child will be graded on their ability to present their item, so please help your child by practicing the five clues they have drawn/written and discussing what the item is called. The other children are encouraged to listen quietly and then ask questions.

On your child's sharing day, he/she must bring only one item. This is the only day your child can bring a special toy, book, etc. Each week there will be a specific assignment. Check below for your child's name and weekly sharing day. Sharing in my class will be a fun guessing game and must be kept a secret from other students.

Here are the steps to follow:

- I. Choose an item from the topic the teacher assigned.
- 2. Have your child write his/her name on a paper lunch bag.
- 3. Your child will have to present <u>five</u> clues in complete sentences about their mysterious object. The clues must help their classmates guess what's inside the bag. <u>Your child needs to draw pictures and/or write words/sentences on the bag to help them remember the five clues.</u>
- 4. Put the item inside the paper bag.
- 5. Have your child practice saying the clues at home many times. The teacher will not read the clues for them.

If your child is absent please be prepared to share the following day. If your child's sharing day falls on a holiday please be prepared to share on Wednesday.
